About Us

Hospital Rooms is an arts and mental health charity that was co-founded by artist Tim A Shaw and curator Niamh White after a close friend was sectioned under the Mental Health Act. They were shocked to find that the environment that she was in at this very distressing time was not only cold and clinical, but also dilapidated and run down.

Hospital Rooms brings extraordinary art and creative activity to some of the most vulnerable and marginalised members of society. So far, we have undertaken a number of acclaimed projects, completed in some of the most challenging mental health settings. These units look after people with severe and enduring mental health conditions such as schizophrenia, bipolar, depression, mania, psychosis, personality disorders and dementia.

We commission world class artists to work with mental health patients and staff in collaborative and responsive workshops. Together, we are radically transforming bleak clinical environments and making them imaginative and thoughtful.

About the project

From 2023 until summer 2024 we will collaborate with Norfolk and Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust (NSFT) and the current Hellesdon Hospital community to bring museum quality artworks and creative activities for people using mental health services.

We are working with 15 artists to run a programme of workshops at the hospital and partner Venues that will inform and contribute to final artworks that will be produced for the space this summer. About the role

As Lead Technician, you will be responsible for overseeing the installation of 15 artworks for our Hellesdon Hospital project between **May and October 2024**. You will be responsible for achieving Hospital Room's high standard of gallery-quality commissions, coordinating alongside our Project team and world-renowned artists.

You will have extensive experience of working on several multidisciplinary installations and excellent communication skills. With a contemporary art, gallery or artist studio background, you will use your expertise to realise high-quality outcomes for our challenging artworks.

You will be proactive and enjoy working closely with others and feel confident working in a challenging environment. Day-to-day you will ensure that our Project team and artists are provided with a high level of technical skill in order to deliver against their ambitions and achieve their artistic visions whilst adhering to our health & safety procedures and all safeguarding policies.
