

# Hospital Rooms Digital Art School 'Textiles Truck' with Liaquat Rasul Step-by-step workshop guide



Join us for this workshop with Liaquat Rasul where we'll be combining a range of materials, intricate linework and layering to create a tactile illustrative composition of a truck. Where will the textiles truck take you?

Materials you will need:

- A4 paper
- Masking tape
- Felt tip pens
- Biro pen
- Lollipop sticks
- PVA glue
- Old receipts
- Scrap cardboard

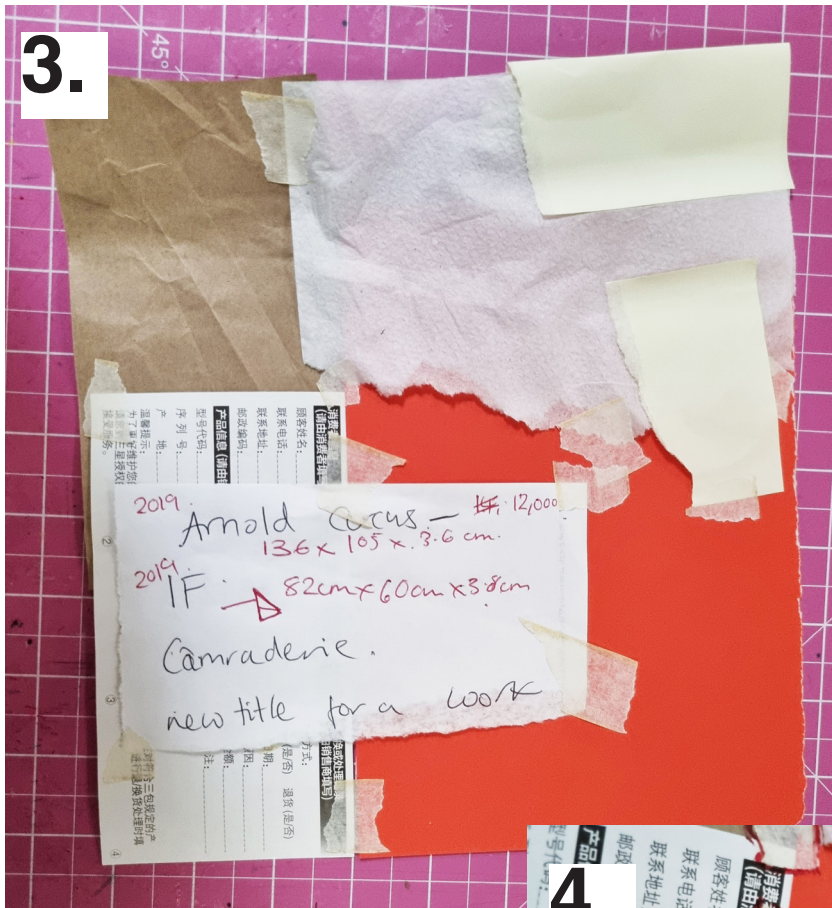
**1. Gather your materials!**

**2. Using the masking tape, draw a circle on some scrap cardboard and tear around it.**



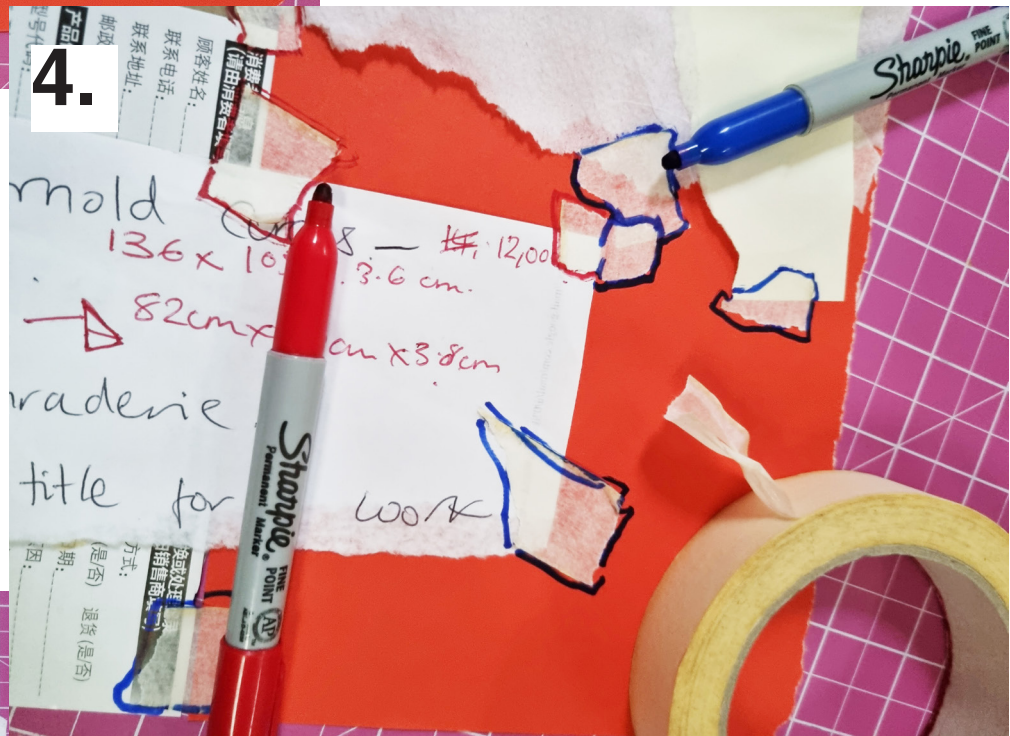

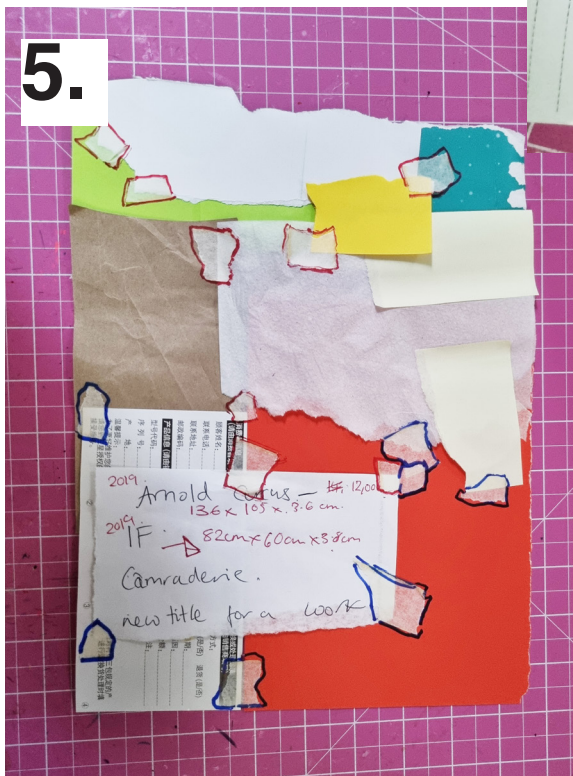
3. Tear your scrap papers and stick together into a square shape using small, torn pieces of masking tape.

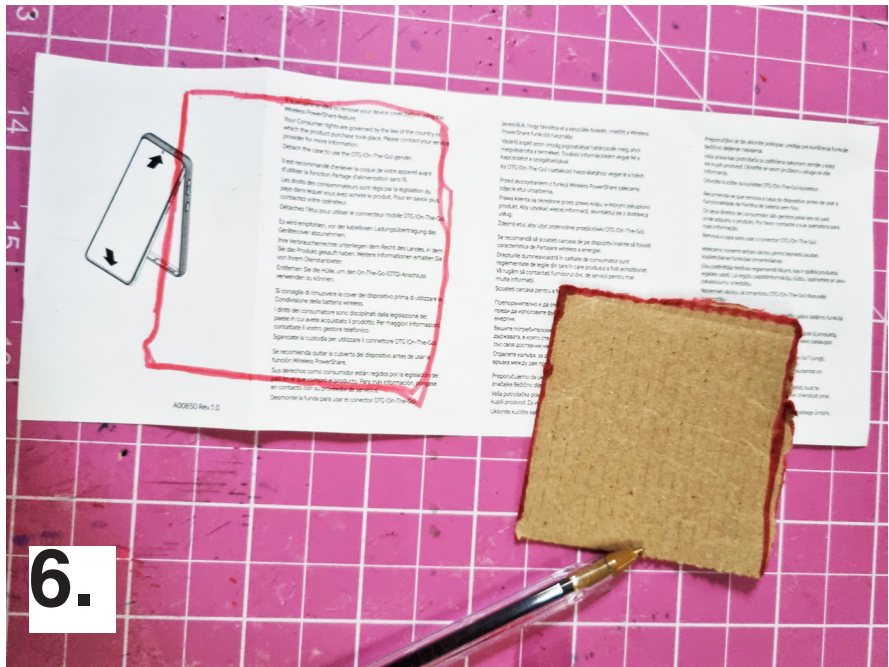
4. Using coloured marker pens, you can outline the torn squares of masking tape.

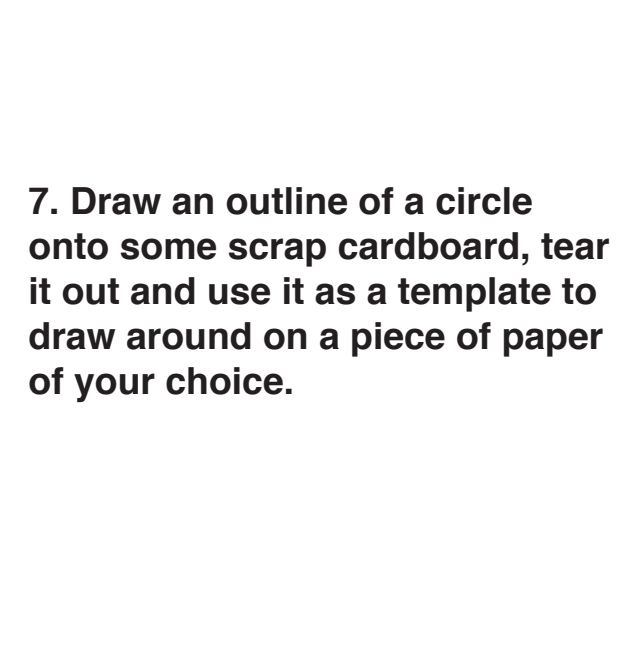
5. Your piece should look something like this so far!

6. Draw an outline of a square onto some scrap cardboard, tear it out and use it as a template to draw around on a piece of paper of your choice.

7. Draw an outline of a circle onto some scrap cardboard, tear it out and use it as a template to draw around on a piece of paper of your choice.

8. If your coffee stirrers or wooden sticks are a natural colour, paint them in a bright colour of your choice with acrylic paint!

9. Stick together some more brightly coloured scrap papers using glue.

10. Use your circle template to draw over the paper you have created and tear out the shapes.



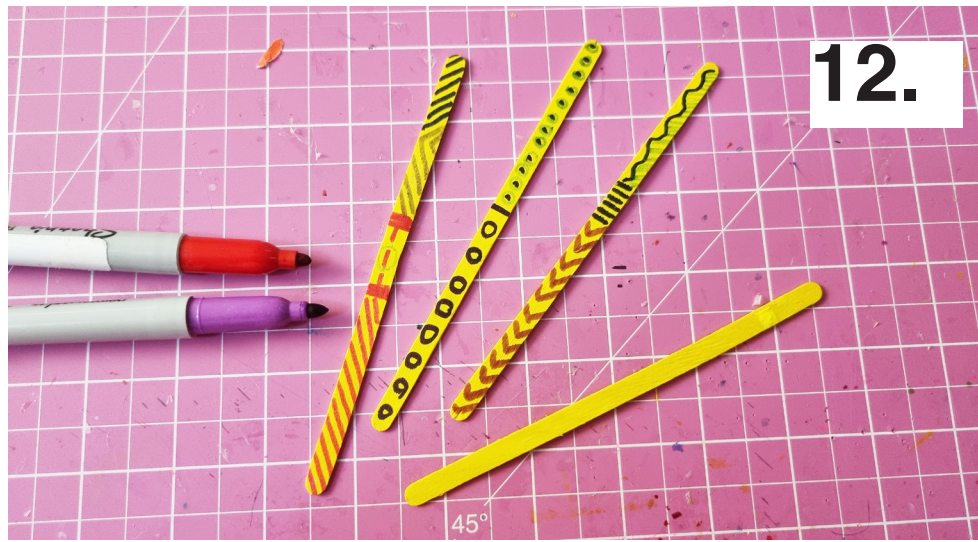

11. Lay over your original patchworked paper from step 5 - your truck should be beginning to take shape!

**12. Decorate your sticks using felt tip or market pens - you can do this with spots, circles, stripes or zig-zags - whatever pattern you like!**

**13. Decorate elements of your truck with stripes, lines and whichever patterns you like best.**

**14. Lay your sticks over your truck and stick down with PVA glue.**
